Re: Update – Asbestos and School Management Plans


The Davis School District has been and is pursuing an aggressive policy regarding asbestos in our schools. Since 1988 each school in the District has been surveyed and inspected twice a year, by a state certified asbestos inspector/management planner. The asbestos in all District buildings has been identified and contained. Federal mandates require the preparation of an Asbestos Management Plan for each school or building used by the District. These plans are available for your personal inspection and are located within the proximity of the school office.

During the past year the boilers were replaced at Davis High Auto Shop and Centerville Jr. High School. All asbestos containing materials associated with the old boiler and pipe insulation was abated. Other asbestos abatement projects were conducted at The Administration Building, Orchard Elementary Multipurpose Rm., South Davis Jr. High Rooms 1,3,& 5. As a result of the remodels at Layton and Viemont High School all asbestos hard fittings in the tunnels, crawl spaces and mechanical rooms have been abated. There was also a small emergency asbestos project completed at Clearfield High School caused by a water pipe failure.

To the best of our knowledge no asbestos materials were used or specified in the remodel/construction of these projects.

Abatements were performed under Environmental Protection Agency guidelines and certified by an Industrial Hygienist.
